16. AWARD OF CONTRACT TO VALLEY CREST LANDSCAPE DEVELOPMENT, INCORPORATED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE SEA TERRACE PARK PROJECT AS PART OF THE GENERAL PARK REHABILITATION PROGRAM

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the City Council (1) approve the contract documents entitled "Sea Terrace Park Project as part of the General Park Rehabilitation Program"; (2) award a contract to Valley Crest Landscape, Incorporated for construction of the Sea Terrace Park Project as part of the General Park Rehabilitation Program including Bid Schedules A, B-1, C-1 and D-1, provided that the City Manager or his designee signs and administers subject contract and may approve additional payment not-to-exceed fifteen percent of this amount for change orders and contingencies; and (3) authorize expenditures for construction management services, soils and material testing, and construction design support for the project as noted in the fiscal impact section.

17. COASTAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AND PROTECTION FOR THE DANA POINT AND NIGUEL STATE MARINE CONSERVATION AREAS

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the City Council 1) authorize the City Manager to direct staff to participate in coastal resource management efforts within the Niguel and Dana Point State Marine Conservation Areas; 2) adopt a Resolution entitled:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DANA POINT, CALIFORNIA, ELIMINATING THE POSITION TITLE OF PARKS COORDINATOR AND AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE POSITION TITLE, SALARY RANGE, AND CLASS SPECIFICATION FOR NATURAL RESOURCE PROTECTION OFFICER;

and 3) designate the Natural Resource Protection Officer as the City's representative in collaborative management efforts with the State of California Department of Fish and Game for the Dana Point and Niguel State Marine Conservation Areas.

18. COUNTY OF ORANGE CITY AID PROGRAM AGREEMENT FY08/09

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the City Council authorize the Mayor to execute three (3) original agreements as required for participation in the County's Proposition 42 City Aid Program (CAP).

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the City Council approve the Mayor's recommended changes to the Council Committee's list for outside agencies and the City's internal Committee, Subcommittees and Task Forces List.
