A Sage in Every Garden



A campaign to to add more than 2,000 native White Sage plants to Orange County gardens. White sage, also known as “Sacred Sage,” is being illegally poached from our wildlands. It is water-wise, a magnet for pollinators, supports wildlife, and grows in every part of the county.

Orange County residents are invited to visit the Dana Point Nature Interpretive Center on **Saturday, January 21**, from 10 a.m. until noon to pick up a *FREE four-inch White Sage. *One per resident while supplies last.

What: One free 4” pot of White sage, (*Salvia apiana*), per Orange County resident

Did You Know?

- White sage is native to Southern California and Northern Baja California and grows NOWHERE else in the world.

You Can Help

- Grow your own! White sage will thrive in your garden or in a pot anywhere in Orange County. It grows 2-3 feet tall with silvery leaves and lavender/white flower stalks.
- Do not buy wild-sourced sage bundles.
- White sage is a great accent plant and pairs well with other California native plants.
