DESCRIPTION

The box displays significant photos from Dana Point’s history.

“The Last Day of Surfing” shows surfers with boards grouped behind Ron Drummond in his canoe in August 1966.

“The Hide Drogher Statue” depicts Richard Henry Dana Jr.’s description of sailors tossing cowhides from the bluff to the cove below. The statue was installed in 1990.

“Scenic Inn” was located on the beach at the base of Dana Point bluffs, welcoming prospective Dana Point lot buyers in 1925.

“Artist’s Rendition of Woodruff’s 1925 Vision of Dana Point” modeled Dana Point as a Mediterranean village with a hotel, golf course, harbor and grand plaza.
