#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

John Chaffetz, Dana Point, thanked everyone responsible for the Memorial Day ceremony at Pines Park on Memorial Day. He stated that Memorial Day has special meaning to him as he had served in the military and that he wished more people knew the significance of Memorial Day.

Linda Brame, Dana Point, felt that there was inadequate parking for the City's major events. She spoke of the parking availability for the Memorial Day service at Pines Park and the lack of parking for the handicapped.

Mayor Bartlett responded that every year the City events become more popular and that Staff would take into consideration the comments made regarding parking when planning future events.

# 22. GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT (GPA07-01), ZONE CHANGE (ZC07-01), ZONE TEXT AMENDMENT (ZTA07-02) AND LOCAL COASTAL PROGRAM AMENDMENT (LCPA07-01) FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 34202 DEL OBISPO STREET (Makar Properties, LLC)

Director of Community Development Butterwick provided a staff report.

Mayor Bartlett opened the Public Hearing.

Howard Zelefsky, Makar Properties, stated that they concur with the Planning Commission's recommendation and also with the mitigation measures that were imposed on the project. He added that they did not provide a site plan because until the rules are in place, they do not know what to design to. He spoke of SOCWA's request that Makar pay for new tanks at their facility.

Scott Howell, Dana Point, spoke regarding the City's need for more parkland and felt that open space should have been a consideration for this property.

Mary Jeffries, Dana Point, spoke regarding the additional letters that she would be submitting from individuals that were against the zone change. She stated that this property was an important gateway to the City and that she did not agree with the proposed zoning as it would be the second highest allowed in the Zoning Code.

Tom Rosales, General Manager of South Orange County Wastewater Authority (SOCWA), asked for the project to be conditioned to address their concerns. He stated that they would request that an odor easement be placed on the property, and for Makar or the successor developer be responsible for paying the fair share for the 4.5 M capital investment that would be needed to cover the costs of the tanks at the SOCWA facility.

Jeff Hoskinson, legal counsel for SOCWA, stated that SOCWA was not opposed to development but is opposed to the current mitigations set forth in the Mitigated Negative Declaration for this project. He felt that the mitigations do not sufficiently address the potential odor impacts of placing residential homes immediately adjacent to an existing operational sewage treatment plant. He stated that based on SOCWA's analysis of the project that there would be the need for an odor easement providing a recorded notice of the potential for odors and covering of the aeration tanks.

Bob Theel, Dana Point, spoke regarding the Dana Villa site and the existing zoning. He stated that the traffic impact report does not propose to share vehicle capacity at the intersection fairly among development interests and that approval would inhibit their development.

Linda Brame, Dana Point, stated that she did not agree with approving the zone change without a plan for development.

Michael Gagnet, Makar, spoke of other projects that have been approved without a plan for development. He stated that they are attempting to lay the basic framework for development. He disagrees with the views of SOCWA and did not believe that the new development should have to cover the cost of new tanks.

Mayor Bartlett closed the public hearing.

Council Member Schoeffel asked how often a City must update its General Plan.
City Attorney Munoz replied that only the Housing Element was required to be updated by law.

Council Member Schoeffel asked if a traffic study and Mitigated Negative Declaration analysis allocate traffic capacity to a vacant parcel.

Director of Community Development Butterwick replied that this analysis did use an ambient growth factor as part of the cumulative analysis. He stated that CEQA only includes known projects or projects that have been filed with the City and that it would be too speculative to include future development of a vacant parcel. He added that there is a mitigation measure that does require additional traffic analysis at the time that a specific project is filed with the City.

Richard Barretto, Linscott, Law & Greenspan, clarified that one of the cumulative projects that was considered was the PCH expansion project. He stated that there is excess capacity but to what impact a future hotel would have is unknown at this time.

City Attorney Munoz asked if the site across Pacific Coast Highway as well as all of the existing zoning in the area was taken into account when the calculations and projections were determined.

Richard Barretto replied that in this particular instance, per CEQA and traffic study guidelines, you go through the process of identifying all known projects that have been approved or projects with applications on file. He stated that including any vacant land or potential development in the traffic study becomes speculative.

Council Member Schoeffel asked if this re-zone were to be approved but the project not built and the owner of the vacant property submitted an application, would the traffic capacity be allocated back to that site.

Richard Barretto replied yes.

Mayor Bartlett asked if the traffic study took into account ingress and egress off of Pacific Coast Highway, Del Obispo, or both.

Richard Barretto replied that it was the assumption that access to the property would come from Del Obispo only.

Mayor Pro Tem Weinberg asked if all four corners of Pacific Coast Highway were developed, would it be the last development that would be left with a reduced traffic capacity.

Richard Barretto replied that the last project approved could have to mitigate the traffic but that he did not believe that this situation would happen. He stated that there were a sufficient number of turn lanes to handle the capacity and how the intersection operated would become a timing situation.

Mayor Pro Tem Weinberg stated that if ingress and egress were taken off of Del Obispo, a traffic light would have to be installed for the exit or the residents would have to go up and make a u-turn which doubles the traffic on Del Obispo; he asked which scenario was considered in your analysis.

Richard Barretto replied that the traffic analysis considered both unsignalized and signalized operation for the site driveway on Del Obispo. He added that the projected traffic volumes by the Makar project were sufficient enough that the installation of a traffic signal would be justified.

Director of Community Development Butterwick clarified that the Planning Commission had continued this hearing because the peak analysis use

did not factor in the summer months. He stated that there was now a mitigation measure for a traffic signal on Del Obispo included.

Mayor Pro Tem Weinberg asked about installing traffic signals so close together.

City Engineer Sinacori replied that if the project comes forward, Staff will have to evaluate whether the signal is warranted.

Council Member Bishop asked if there was enough data for the analysis since Pacific Coast Highway was just recently expanded.

Richard Barretto replied that the data that they had collected was prior to the widening. He stated that there was better traffic flow because of the additional lanes.

Director of Community Development clarified that the evaluation of the future traffic capacity did consider the improvements to Pacific Coast Highway.

Council Member Bishop asked if there was a requirement for open space.

Director of Community Development Butterwick replied that there was a requirement for open space.

City Architect Tilton clarified that there was 200 square feet of open space was required per unit; 100 of which is private and the other 100 would be for the common area. He stated that another important factor in developing the site is how much land area can be covered, and in this case it is limited to 40 percent.

Council Member Bishop stated that he has heard some concerns about the heights of the proposed buildings and their restricting air flows.

Director Butterwick replied that absent the site plan that shows a location of the building footprints, roof heights, and configuration it would only conjuncture on Staff's part but that it would be part of the future environmental evaluation for a specific project. He stated that the Mitigated Negative Declaration did not provide an evaluation of the air flow across the property.

Council Member Bishop stated that he and the Mayor had toured the sewer plant on Friday. He added that from the tour he learned that the homes should only be affected by the prevailing wind during a Santa Ana condition and that 80-90 percent of the sewage that the plant collects comes from outside the City.

Council Member Schoeffel stated that the Planning Commission raised the density of the residential and lowered the density of the commercial; he asked Director Butterwick if he could recall the rationale.

Director Butterwick replied that the change was associated with trip generation for commercial development and that the reduction of the commercial square footage had a beneficial affect on the circulation.

Council Member Bishop stated that he was concerned with the traffic flow in the area and does not know how to mitigate it if all of the vacant properties were to be developed. He added that he was also concerned about the odor and how the kids at the baseball fields have to smell the odor.

Council Member Schoeffel stated that the zone change was an effort to keep pace with what the City is becoming. He added that for this first step, he would support the recommendation.

Mayor Pro Tem Weinberg felt that a park at the site could generate more traffic than the residential uses. He felt comfortable that there were enough safeguards in place that the project would not be a detriment to the City or traffic flow and that he would support the proposal.

Mayor Bartlett stated that she was concerned with the traffic and odor situation but felt that was something that could be dealt with when a project was brought forward. She added that she would be in favor of moving forward with the proposed zone change.

Mayor Pro Tem Weinberg stated that since the majority of the materials collected at SOCWA come from outside of the City that maybe the City should look into making SOCWA mitigate the odors.
