








2010 Dana Point Grand Prix of Cycling



Habits & Habitat: New Landscape Ideas and Incentives

Te may be next to the largest body of water on earth, but we live in a semi-arid desert. This means we get little rain, and Kentucky bluegrass is not a native plant.

In our region, our landscape 'habits' don't necessarily complement our 'habitat.' Removing thirsty turf and seeking California-friendly plants can start a whole new adventure in landscape design that is authentic to our land's heritage. These plants need little-to-no water (once established), soil preparation, fertilizer or pesticide. They attract hummingbirds, butterflies and other native wildlife. Consult your nursery for information on alternatives that are right for your yard. Here are a few ideas:

- California Meadow Sage: Low groundcover; rich green grasslike foliage.
- California Buckwheat 'Dana Point': Low groundcover; light green leaves; cream-colored flowers. (Ice Plant alternative)
- Coast Live-Oak: Tall, fastgrowing tree; dark green leaves; acorns. (Alternative to tropical Ficus that has extensive surface roots)
- Western Sycamore: Tall, fastgrowing tree; arching branches; bright green leaves; fall color. (Alternative to Australian-native Eucalyptus)
- Lemonade Berry: Tall evergreen shrub; white-to-pink flowers; red berries, may use for lemonade.

(Acacia alternative)

- Ceanothus: Native wild lilac shrub; various sizes; deep green foliage; white, blue, purple flowers. (Oleander alternative)
- Cleveland Sage/Lilac Verbena: Aromatic groundcover/shrub, lavender-colored flowers. (Alternative to French-native Lavender)
- California Wild Rose: Fragrant pink blossoms; large orange-red fruit, may use for jam or tea.

If you love the look of a green lawn, there are scores of synthetic turf products that are viable, attractive alternatives to traditional lawns. They require no water, or fertilizer or pesticides and remain green year-round. Today's synthetic turf is unlike vesterday's artificial grass. It looks and feels real and comes in various textures and shades, including UV protection. Like natural grass, synthetic turf allows water and other liquids to drain into the soil.

In landscape regulations, the City of Dana Point encourages use of drought-tolerant, non-invasive plants and permeable landscape material, which includes hardscape, rockscape and synthetic turf. Call the Planning Division at 949-248-3572 for specifications on minimum areas required for living plants.

Rebate Program\$: South Coast Water District has two rebate programs for single-family residences with established, traditional lawns. These financial incentives encourage

homeowners to add a little 'native beauty' and/or low water-use options to their yards. The District has funded \$50,000 for rebates through June 2010. Single family residences interested in participating in the program should contact the District no later than June 1, 2010., but don't delay as rebates are given on a firstcome, first-served basis.

California-Friendly Plant Rebate Program. Homeowners who remove at least 250 square feet of traditional turf and replace it with Californiafriendly plants will be eligible to receive up to \$300 in rebates on plant purchases. There are some 40 native and drought-tolerant trees, shrubs and groundcover from which to choose. Please see the list of qualifying plants on SCWD's website at www.scwd.org.

Synthetic Turf Rebate Program. Homeowners who remove up to 500 square feet of traditional turf and replace it with synthetic turf will be eligible to receive rebates of \$2.30 per square foot installed.


